

Prof. Dr. Jochen Zschau, born 1944 in Lauenburg/Pommern received his degree as a geophysicist from the University of Munich and started his teaching career at the University of Kiel. He worked as a visiting fellow in Boulder/Colorado and became director at the Institute of Geophysics, University of Kiel, in 1980. In 1992 he moved to the GeoForschungsZentrum Potsdam (GFZ), where he now heads the department "Physics of the Earth". His research focuses on earthquakes, volcanism, natural disasters and the development of seismic early warning systems. His present functions are among others, Former Vice-President of the European Seismological Commission, chairman of the German Task Force Committee for Earthquakes and project coordinator for the seismological component of the German-Indonesian Tsunami Early Warning System for the Indian Ocean.
